Our two-week Foundation in Global Leadership course is designed for ambitious students who want to make a meaningful impact in the world. This immersive experience introduces students to global affairs, international relations, and the complexities of leadership in an interconnected society. Through interactive sessions and real-world simulations, students gain a foundation in the skills needed to navigate global challenges with empathy and strategic thinking.

The course emphasises the development of a global mindset, encouraging students to explore diverse cultural perspectives, historical contexts, and ethical considerations that shape today's world. Topics include human rights, global

economics, and environmental sustainability,
helping students understand the factors that
influence decision-making on a global stage.
Engaging debates, model diplomatic exercises, and
scenario-based simulations provide opportunities
for students to hone their critical thinking and
communication skills.

Course Objectives

Foundation in Global Leadership is an innovative programmeme for students aged 12-16 who are passionate about making a difference. At Eton College, we understand the importance of nurturing young leaders who are informed, empathetic, and prepared to tackle global challenges. This course introduces students to leadership, international relations, and social impact, providing a foundation for those who wish to become thoughtful, effective leaders.

Module 1

Introduction to Global Issues and International Relations

Explore key global issues like climate change, human rights, and diplomacy. Understand the role of international organisations and develop critical thinking on how to create positive global change.

Module 2

Leadership Skills and Decision Making

Develop leadership skills, focusing on communication, ethical decision-making, and adaptability. Practical exercises and team activities help students build confidence, resilience, and cultural awareness in diverse leadership contexts.

Module 3

Social Impact and Community Building

Learn about social entrepreneurship, civic engagement, and project management. Apply knowledge through hands-on projects addressing real-world challenges, fostering a sense of responsibility in global leadership.



Previous projects include:

Youth United for Human Rights: Fostering Respect and Responsibility Across Borders

A project where a student developed an initiative to promote human rights awareness among young people, focusing on collaboration, education, and advocacy.

This project provided students with the opportunity to think creatively, act purposefully, and demonstrate their potential as global leaders, and to showcase their understanding of complex international issues, strategic thinking, and their commitment to positive change.



Time to Shine

For their Time to Shine project, students will step into the role of a global leader, tackling an important international issue or designing a plan for social impact. Whether they're creating a peace-building initiative, proposing sustainable economic policies, or designing a community outreach project, students will present their ideas in a high-stakes setting, pitching to a panel of their peers and instructors.



Our Approach to Your Learning

Designed to inspire students to think critically, communicate effectively, and act with empathy. We combine theoretical knowledge with interactive, hands-on learning experiences that encourage teamwork, leadership, and a deep understanding of global issues. Guided by experienced instructors, students gain the skills and confidence to lead in their communities, preparing to be responsible, impactful global citizens.
